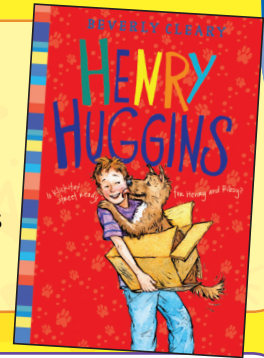


PROBLEM SOLVING
